HMB226H1F - Holistic Indigenous Health

Course Description: What is holistic health in an Indigenous framework? How can holistic health (physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual) be ethically explored to inform health and healing? What is cultural safety in health care systems? This course explores the effects of traditional practices, culture, activities, arts, land-based healing, music and ceremony in health and healing.

Estimated course enrolment: 15 students

Schedule: Lectures on Tuesday&Thursday 1:00 - 3:00 pm

Sessional Dates: May 1, 2023 - June 30, 2023

Qualifications: Candidate should be a postdoctoral fellow or enrolled in a Ph.D or Master's program at the University of Toronto. Recent scholarly background and contribution in Indigenous Health is required. Familiarity and respect for Haudenosaunee community protocols are strongly preferred.

Description of Duties:

- Preparing and overseeing an on-site experiential and land-based field trip for 15 students scheduled for May 23-25 in the Haudenosaunee Community of Six Nations, Ontario
- Helping students to grow and develop critical thinking skills, learning about the multi-faceted nature of Indigenous health, and building a respectful relationship between the University of Toronto and the Six Nations community
- Participating in tours and activities linking culture, land and health with local community members
